In September, Stan Rosenberg led a subcommittee to determine if there would be enough interest to form a regional SIG ... and the response was strong. Keith challenged the audience to create some practice pieces and bring a goblet to the next session to share with the group.

Of course the meeting would not have been in character without a door prize donated by Dap Cole. The lucky winner of the 'turning skirt' was Kathy Powell, who models this functional garment in the inset photo. The group also raffled off Keith's goblet, which was won by Richard Shoulkin. 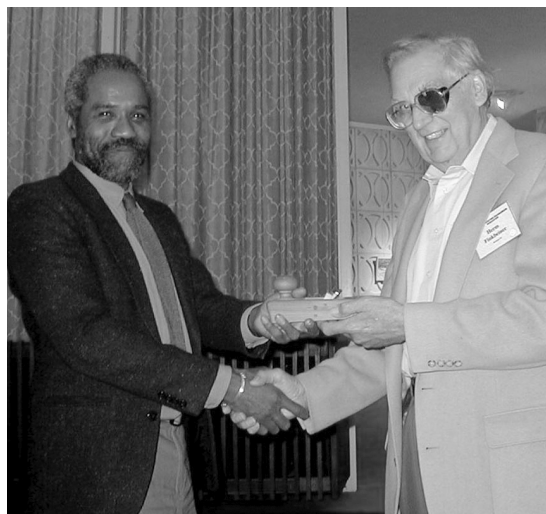


Michael Puryear Gives Fiske Memorial Lecture

On November 11 Michael Puryear gave the 9th annual Fiske Memorial Lecture at the Unitarian Church in Schenectady. Michael's topic was art as a part of the craft of furniture building, and how using an artistic theme in a piece can help to make it serve the purpose for which it was intended and simultaneously be so pleasing to the eye that it is clearly a work of art.

Michael illustrated his lecture with many of the pieces he has built and how he has incorporated curves into items that normally would be straight lines only. The question and answer session was lively, with many NWA members clearly intrigued by the idea of getting away from using just straight lines. He did not go so far as to suggest that the curved pieces could be made on a lathe! 🐾

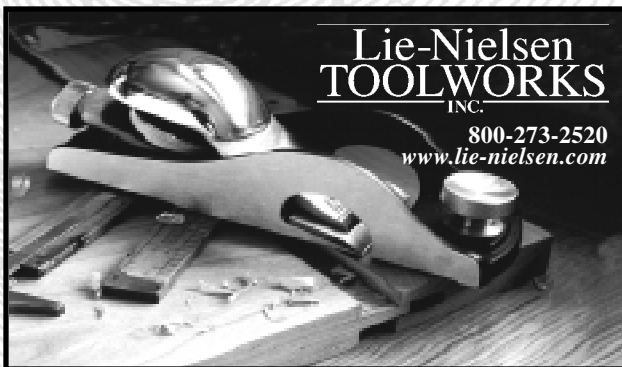

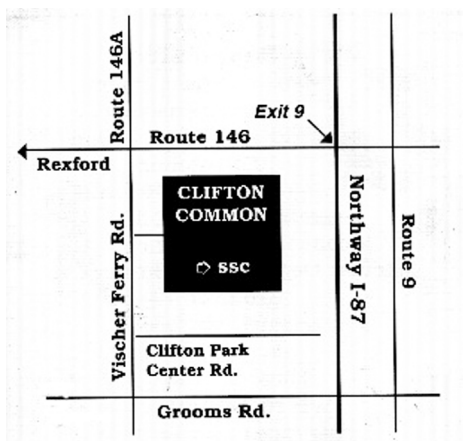
