On January 9th we will kick off 2014 by returning to the Shaker Meeting House for our monthly meeting. If you haven't already done so, it will be none too soon to begin sharpening your skills and applying them to projects for Showcase. With that in mind the topic of January's meeting is Sharpening.

Those of you who made the January 2012 meeting will recall an excellent presentation on Coated Abrasives by Doug Jensen, an Application Engineer with the Norton division of Saint-Gobain Abrasives. Through Doug's good offices we have recruited Patricia Dawson (also of Saint-Gobain) to speak to us about sharpening stones. Ms. Dawson is a Product Manager responsible for their Pike Sharpening Stones among

other things and has been with Saint-Gobain for about 8 years. She has a degree in Ceramic Engineering form Alfred University and an MBA from Babson College.

Patricia plans to cover a brief history of sharpening stones, an overview of the various products available and



a comparison of the sharpening properties of each and will bring samples of different types of benchstones: aluminum oxide, silicon carbide, Arkansas and waterstones. We will have some sharpening stations set up and you are invited to bring a chisel, plane iron or small knife along so that some of you as time allows can test out the different stones and get a feel for how they perform.

This will be a very interesting and informative meeting whether you are new to our craft or like me have been "honing" your sharpening skills for going on 40 years. As always we will have announcements, refreshments and a raffle, so bring your ears, your appetite and your wallet which I hope will not be completely empty from the preceding weeks.

Truck Assistants - Moving equipment & materials into trucks from Mustang, out of trucks at Civic Center & back again (Thursday 3:00-8:00, Friday 8:00am-done, Sunday 5:00pm-9:00 and/or Monday 8:00am-10:00am)

Late entries will be entered for display only Any woodworker may exhibit his/her work. You do not need to be a NWA member. There is no entry fee

Exhibits are not to be removed from the floor before 5 pm Sunday.

You may exhibit any number of pieces in more than one category, but only one piece per category for judging.

Award winning pieces from a previous Showcase event are not eligible for competition, but may be entered for display and will be acknowledged as previous winners. Judges have the right to re-categorize entries. There must be at least three entrants in a category for an entry to be judged.

The exhibit hall is not a commercial area. Price tags or literature other than small business cards are not allowed and will be removed and disposed of.

The decisions of the judges are final. At the discretion of the judges, some awards may not be given.



To encourage more entries & pre-registration, NWA Showcase is having a raffle. Each pre-registered piece, judged or non-judged, brought to the Exhibit Hall earns you a raffle ticket. making I had only scratched the surface. When it was announced that there was still room in the workshop, I knew I was going.

I am so glad I did. The workshop was terrific! Doug started with a discussion of the principles of design and the tools we have to implement them. I was pleased to add to the very little I know about this subject. I was particularly taken with his suggestion to try to include an element of surprise in a design and I could see on the boxes that he brought for our inspection that he had done so on several of them.

The rest of the workshop was spent with Doug demonstrating how to build a mitered box, including building the sleds and jigs that go along with such an endeavor. I noticed that he had made some improvements in some of the jigs that he shows how to make in the two books of his I own. We learned about the ratio of plus or minus two, the use of spacer blocks, and using a story stick for the hinges. And when I thought my brain couldn't absorb much more, Doug filled the last part of the workshop demonstrating how to build a sliding router jig for making box joints.

Great as the woodworking part of the workshop was, Doug also shared with us his philosophy of how to deal with the frustration of being a "real person" who will inevitably make mistakes in woodworking. He said that instead of being angry with yourself, forgive yourself, and that sometimes mistakes could be a creative design opportunity. He quoted a psychologist who had written, "My purpose is peace, my function is to forgive." I was so impressed with the thought that I wrote it down in my notes.

Spending two days observing the wisdom Doug has acquired working with his hands was a great opportunity, I'm glad I didn't miss. It is always a pleasure to come back to my own workshop and apply what I have learned.

Thank you Doug Stowe and thank you NWA.


