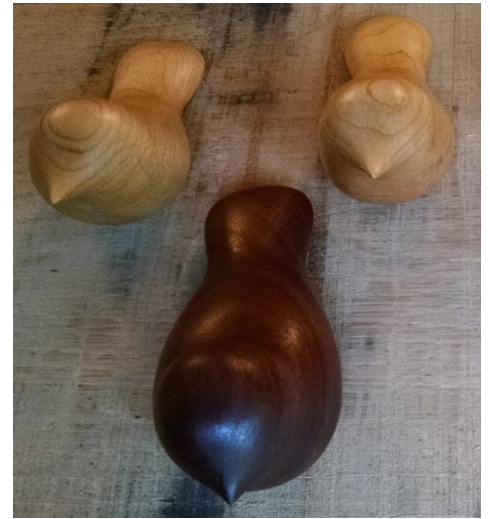

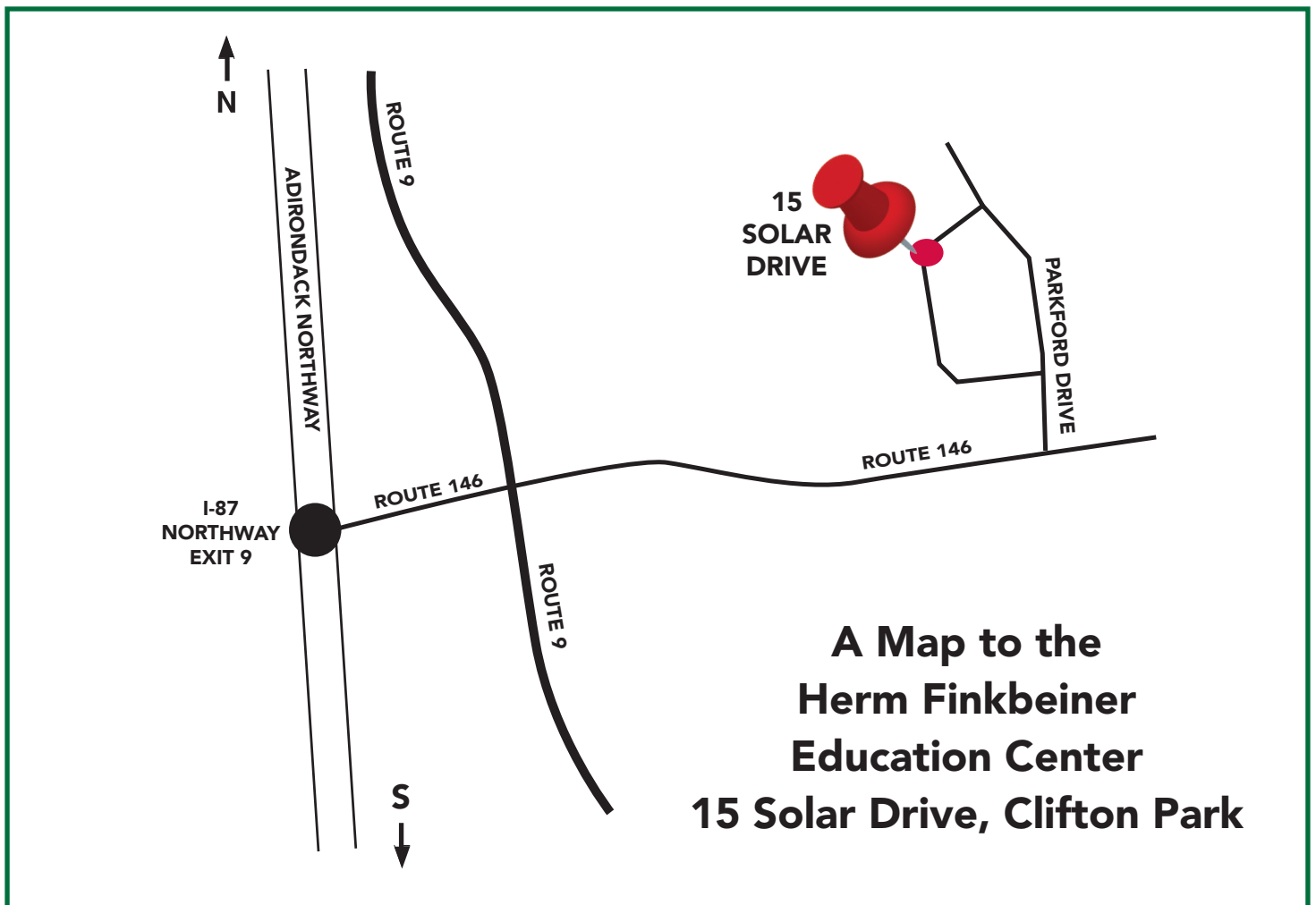

## Mid-Hudson Chapter News

**Battery Back-Up:** In a bit of a diversion from woodworking topics, Fred Roe shared his project to come up with a battery back-up that could be used in emergency situations. Fred's application could be used to operate a sump pump, electric light, or for electric start for a snowblower.

Of course, using a battery requires adaptations for direct current (DC). Since most appliances are geared for alternating current (AC), an inverter is needed. Fred explained that not all inverters are created equal: many of the cheaper inverters do not provide a full sine wave of alternating current – the Harbor Freight product used in his prototype is an example of an inverter that produces a ragged sine wave. Some appliances require a full sine wave (and therefore steady wattage) to operate, like computers, TV's and motors. A full sine wave inverter may output 1500 watts.

However, there are a number of DC applications which are practical: light bulbs, auto adapters, winch, RV (e.g., pump, etc). It is also relatively easy to convert laptops to DC, because they already use a converter, but voltage is the key. On the other hand, DC is not a good application to generate heat (too much draw).

Fred demonstrated a number of components for his project, including battery and solar panel from Harbor Freight, as well as a DC light bulb. His outfit can also power a CFC bulb, but it needs to be wired to a car adapter and 10 amps the maximum that can be drawn. Fred is continuing to experiment with his battery back-up and will keep the group updated.

**Read to Zoey:** Jim and Debbie Lee collaborated to supply pet-themed Bookmarks for a reading program they sponsor. The bookmarks were scrolled from a

pack of 50-60 sheets of holiday themed cardstock. The name of the program is 'Read to Zoey' (the Lee's poodle).

Zoey is a certified therapy dog through Therapy Dogs International. She is a "Tail Waggin' Tutor" at the Town of Ulster Library and the Saugerties Public Library. She even has her own Facebook page in that name!

For the past year, children read aloud to Zoey -- it's a wonderful chance for children to increase their confidence in reading in a relaxing, stress-free environment. With dogs, you can't make a mistake because they don't care if you do or judge. The kids either bring a favorite book or can pick one out at the library.

The participants are given a bookmark after they read to Zoey. Jim and Debbie decided to fashion paw print styled bookmarks which Jim scroll-sawed. The children all seem to think it's Zoey's little foot that

- Entry forms must be received by March 23, 2015 to be eligible for judging. Late entries will be entered for display only.
- All Showcase exhibit items must be brought to the City Center between 3:00 pm and 6:45 pm, Friday March 27, 2015.
- Exhibits are not to be removed from the floor before 5 pm Sunday.
- You may exhibit any number of pieces in more than one category, but only one piece per category for judging.
- Award winning pieces from a previous Showcase event are not eligible for competition, but may be entered for display and will be acknowledged as previous winners.

### ***Judges have the right to re-categorize entries.***

- Only pieces entered in one of the Turning Categories will be displayed in the Turner's Gallery. Ex., if a turned piece is entered in the Accessories Category, it will not be in the Turners Gallery but in the Main Gallery.
- In order to be fair to everyone, if the judges deem that an entry from Miscellaneous should be in another category they will make the change. If the woodworker already has a judged entry in that category, the changed entry will no longer be judged.
- The exhibit hall is not a commercial area. Price tags or literature other than small business cards are not allowed and will be removed and disposed of.
- The decisions of the judges are final. At the discretion of the judges, some awards may not be given.

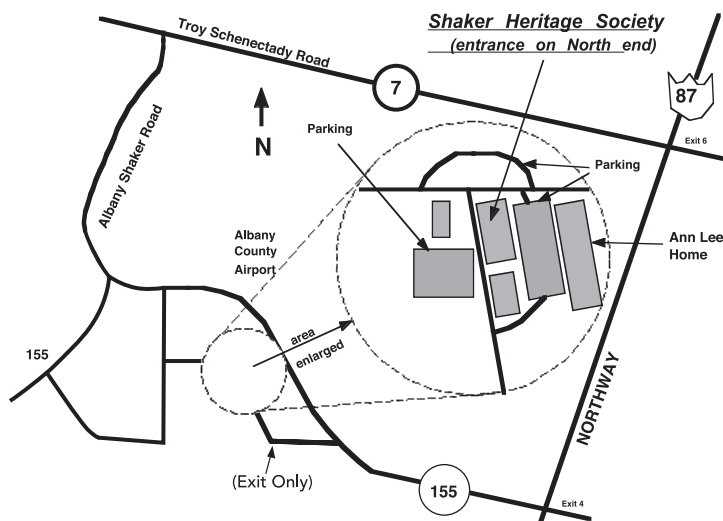
