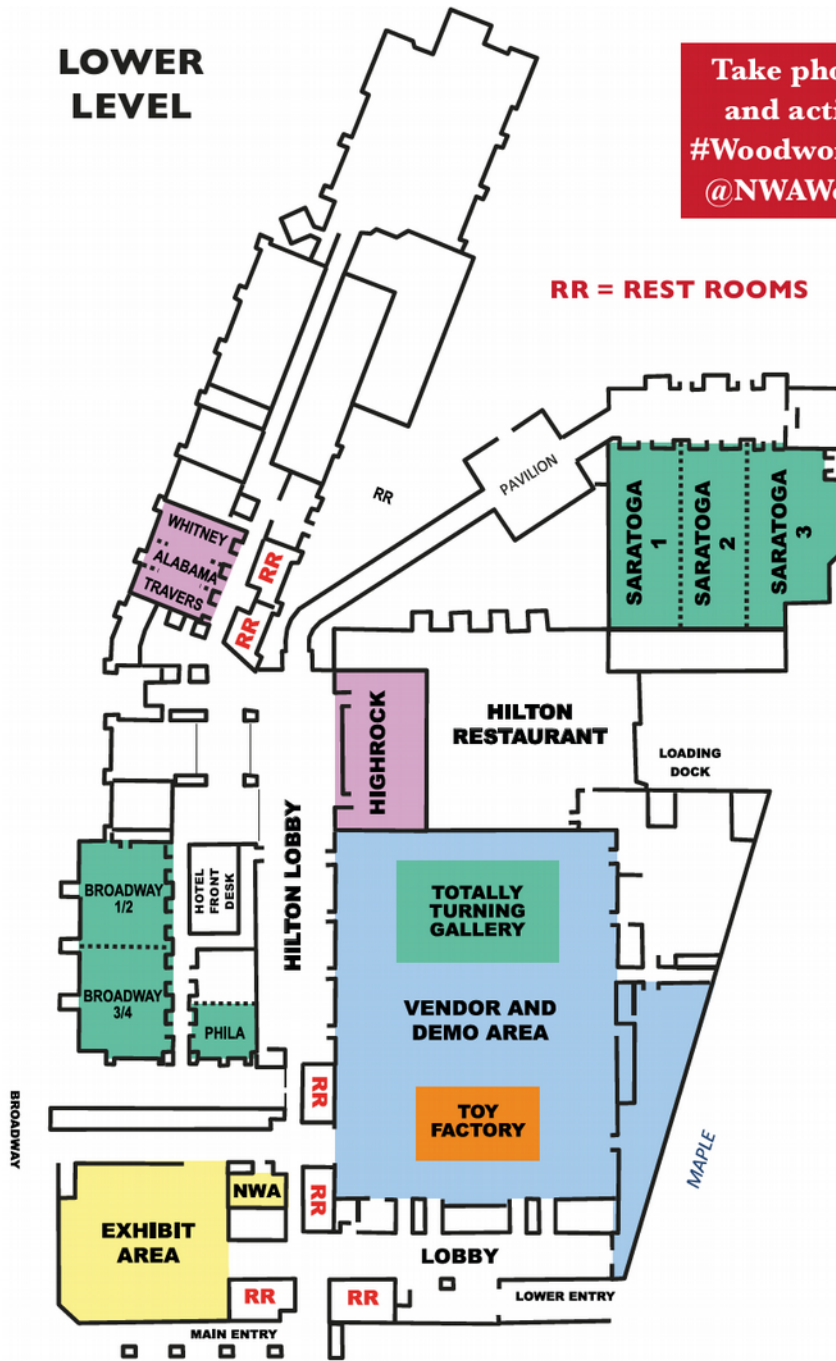

Totally Turning Symposium has a free exhibit gallery dedicated to their woodcraft:

ALTERNATE MATERIALS: Alternate materials that are cast or added to wood to create unique, original pieces including plastics, resin, metal, stone, etc.

ARTISTIC: Exquisitely Finished Turned art - carved, pierced, sculpted, or otherwise enhanced

BOWLS: Any turning which resembles or may be used as a bowl

HOLLOW FORMS: Narrow, closed, or open mouth hollowed turnings either with hand tools or jog assisted, includes vases, urns, weed pots, etc.

JEWELRY: Turned items for wrist, neck, finger, or other body wear

NOVICE: Those who began turning within the last twelve months. Covers all categories for any turned piece from a new turner.

PENS: Turned fine writing implements

PLATTER: Any turning which resembles a plate or platter

SEGMENTED: Turnings comprised of multiple systematic layered individual pieces

SPINDLE: Any piece turned primarily between centers with marginal hollowing; ornaments, pepper mills, rolling pins, finials, canes, goblets, boxes, eccentric, offset, etc.

YOUTH:** For turners 17 years old or younger. Covers all categories for any turned piece from a young turner.
